1.0 Purpose of Report

The following report provides a community update and key performance information in relation to the Hebburn area over the past 6 weeks (report generated Wednesday 1st July 2026).

2.0 Key Updates

Incidents

South Tyneside Area Command is showing a total of 40,353 incidents in the last 12 months.

Within Hebburn area, a total of 498 incidents were reported to Northumbria Police in the current 6-week period.

It is expected in line with previous trends that incidents will show a slight increase as we move towards the summer months. This is typically a time when we see increased anti-social behaviour (both youth and adult) and an increase in the use of off road / electric motorcycles.

Throughout this report the following date periods will be used:

- This reporting period – 21st May 2026-30th June 2026
- Same period 2025 – 21st May 2025 - 30th June 2025
- Previous reporting period – 5th April- 30th May 2026

Of the 232 recorded crimes committed in the past 6 weeks, the highest categories of offences are as follows:

- Violence against the person (without injury)-63
- Violence against the person (with injury) – 23
- Criminal damage – 25
- Theft and handling – 22
- Burglary - 12
- Public disorder – 20
- Sexual offences – 2

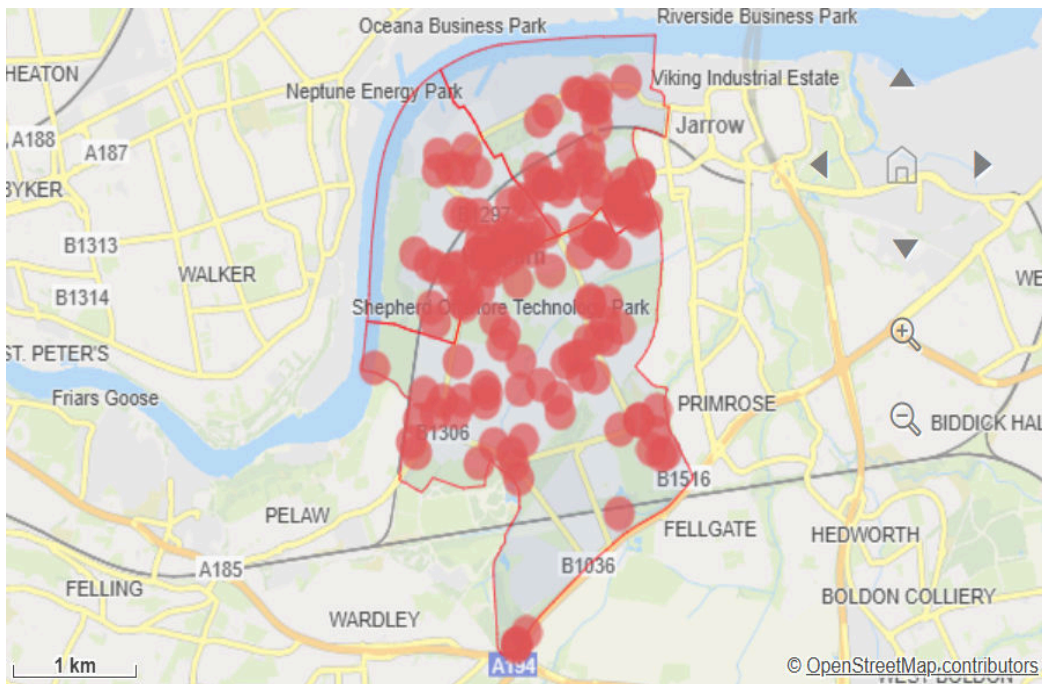
The streets with the highest number of crimes for this period are:

In the current 6 week period there have been a total of 58 ASB incidents, the highest categories are as follows:

- Nuisance – 19
- Neighbourly disputes - 13
- Motor cycle - 6

NPT have conducted, and continue to conduct, dedicated patrols in ASB hotspot areas. By working alongside colleagues from South Tyneside Council's Business carrying out joint visits to regular neighbour disputes and issuing orders where required. Patrols have also been linked with Community Responder Teams as we continue to tackle those who cause ASB throughout the area.

A rise in ASB at this time of year is expected as the weather improves and we move into the lighter nights.

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
